Dear Chair McConnell and Ranking Member Coons:

We respectfully request that you provide robust funding for the Department of Defense STARBASE program ("STARBASE") in the Fiscal Year (FY) 2026 Defense Appropriations bill.

STARBASE plays a critical role in building a strong STEM workforce by engaging young students in fifth grade to build a strong STEM foundation that extends through middle school and high school. This foundation is crucial to the long-term success of fostering a highly skilled workforce. Since 1993, STARBASE has served more than 1.8 million students from 42 states and territories. Each year, more than 16,000 volunteers contribute nearly 195,000 hours — at an estimated value of \$6.7 million — to the program, demonstrating the strong support it receives from the communities it serves.

Located on military bases, STARBASE programs utilize military personnel as role models and leverage their expertise to provide students with exposure to real-world STEM applications and careers. This collaboration provides students with not just technical knowledge but also a sense of patriotism and pride, which is unique compared to other federal STEM programs. Given the growing emphasis on a high-tech future, programs like STARBASE are essential in preparing students for the workforce. Importantly, this program also plays a pivotal role in bolstering relationships between the DOD and local communities, assuring access to military installations while fostering awareness of military culture.

Currently, more than 90 STARBASE programs are located on military installations across the country. In FY 2025, the DOD started five new STARBASE programs: Blackstone Readiness Center, Virginia; Marine Corps Air Station Cherry Point, North Carolina; Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington; Cannon Air Force Base, New Mexico; and Warfield Air National Guard Base, Maryland. The first Coast Guard program at Elizabeth City, North Carolina is expected to receive start-up funding in FY 2025, if funds are available. With an additional 17 locations remaining on the waiting list for a program in the future, ample funding is required to sustain a highly educated and skilled workforce capable of meeting the advanced STEM needs of the DOD.

We appreciate the Subcommittee's past support for the STARBASE program and request the Committee provide robust funding for STARBASE in Defense-wide, Operations and Maintenance, Civil Military Programs, for continued operation of the program in the Fiscal Year 2026 Defense Appropriations Bill.
